



GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

To ensure an enjoyable experience for all players, we ask that the following etiquette guidelines are observed at all times.

GOLF CART USAGE & CART PATH

Observe all cart path rules and posted signage. During wet conditions or on designated holes, carts must remain on the path, such as the first, ninth, and eighteenth holes.

When possible, follow the 90-degree rule and avoid unnecessary wear to the turf. Always park the golf cart in a position that allows for a direct exit towards the next tee and never in front of the green.

AROUND THE GREEN

After finishing a hole, leave the green promptly and proceed to the next one.

Record scores at the next teeing area, not on the green.

CARE OF THE COURSE

All players are expected to help maintain the condition of the course:

- Repair ball marks on greens
- Replace or fill divots
- Rake bunkers after use

PLAYER ASSISTANCE

Player assistants may monitor the pace of play and adherence to etiquette.

Reports of slow play or repeated breaches may be referred to The Golf Shop.

ARRIVAL & PREPAREDNESS

Please arrive at least 20 minutes prior to your tee time to allow for check-in and warm-up. Late arrivals disrupt the tee sheet and impact other players.

PACE OF PLAY / "READY GOLF"

Play without unnecessary delay. Be prepared to hit when it is your turn and proceed directly to your ball.

"Ready Golf" is encouraged. If another player is delayed, you may play when it is safe to do so.

Be sociable, but reserve your extended conversations for the 19th hole.

KEEP UP WITH THE GROUP AHEAD

Maintain your position on the course at all times. If you fall behind and cannot keep pace, kindly allow faster groups to play through.

If searching for a lost ball, please wave the group behind through.

"FORE!"

If your ball may endanger another player, immediately yell "fore" to provide a warning.

Player safety is a top priority.

OUTSIDE ALCOHOL

Outside alcoholic beverages are not permitted.

All alcohol must be purchased through The Clubhouse in accordance with licensing regulations.
